We can also compare our performance with other schools that are using the Cambridge Curriculum. That is a statistic that will get Greenfields and Study Technology noticed. Because if there was ever a tool that can be used to increase the ability of an individual to study, learn and apply, it is Study Technology.

As Executive Head, I have two very competent deputies in the guise of Mrs Beryl Garside as Head of Junior School and Mr Dave Hutt as Head of Senior School who both run the day-to-day affairs of their area of the school. They are both great to work with and will enable me to focus much-needed attention on external affairs such as inspections, regulatory requirements, yearly and monthly programmes, long-term planning, school policy reviews and so on, all of which are designed to strengthen and enhance what we are doing at Greenfields.

Junior School Sports Day 2015

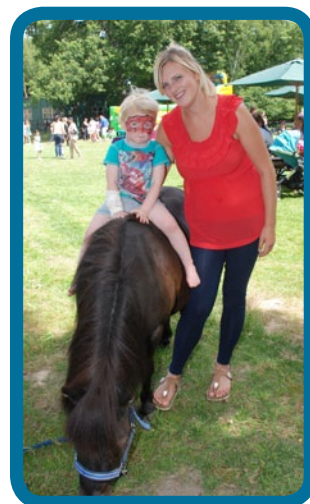

Head of Senior School

Greenfields' benevolent atmosphere makes my new job as Head of the Senior School such a joy. Yet we as a school are now going much further than providing a safe and compassionate ambience.

Academic excellence has become a byword in all our scholastic activities. Using the curriculum provided by Cambridge International Examinations (CIE), Greenfields is diligently working towards a considerably higher educational standard than is expected by the Department of Education or other schools across the country. We've recently extended this curriculum into our English as a Foreign Language classes, and coupled it with the fabulous Rosetta Stone language programme to ensure that our international students get a living, breathing grasp of the English language that will serve them well for the rest of their lives.

Many other private schools, of course, strive for high academic standards but this often leads them into becoming dispassionately selective. Only those who pass their 11+ or Common Entrance exams are allowed in. Here at Greenfields we take a different view. We do not feel that the innate potentials of a student are wholly defined by their academic graphs. Many of the students that do not pass those entrance exams have terrific abilities in non-academic spheres, and we believe that it is our responsibility to both recognise and nurture such talents. We therefore now offer an educational service that emphasises such students' specific, unique talents whilst still providing them with the key academic skills they will need in life.

Yet simply having a curriculum alone accomplishes little unless it is actually understood and applied. We at the school know that the degree to which our students,

on their own determinism, apply the priceless educational elixir of Study Technology is the degree to which they will understand and apply any future material – from basic arithmetic to rocket science! The systematic monitoring of how we add value to each and every student particularly through the use of Study Technology is thus a large part of my job.

The school is also working to stimulate application through a strengthening of its extra-curricular delivery. The latest addition to this side of our service is the introduction of the world-renowned Duke of Edinburgh Award, for which the school has recently become a fully licensed centre. The value of such a programme was reflected in a national survey involving some of the biggest businesses in the country: the D of E ranked first place (above such things as work experience) as the qualification employers valued most on applicants' CVs.

So needless to say, there is always a lot happening here at Greenfields behind the scenes, and it's all part of a passion to provide our students with the type of school experience that they can treasure for the rest of their lives. It is a mission like no other, and one that makes me swell with pride whenever I am asked where I work and what I do.

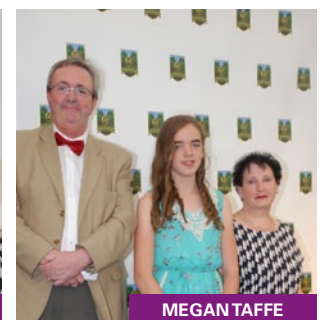
After the graduation ceremony the Head Teacher hosted a tea party for the graduates and their families along with VIP's, Trust members, teachers and friends.

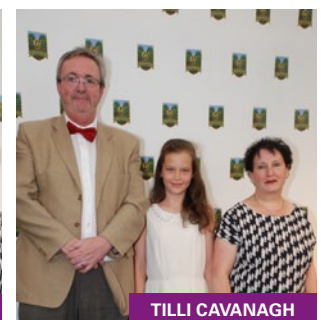

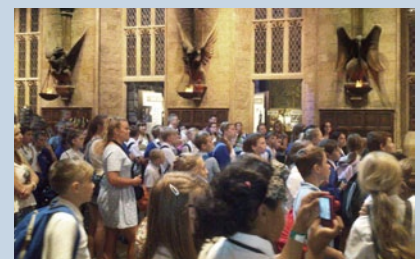
In May a group of the juniors went to Wakehurst Place where they learnt all about plant reproductive cycles and were given lots of practical field and laboratory experience.

Greenfields Opens New Junior School Facilities!

On the 3rd of September 2015, East Grinstead Town Mayor, Mr Dick Sweatman, cut the ribbon to officially open the new Junior School extension for Greenfields School. The ceremony was attended by local parents, students, staff and many visitors.

This huge new building was the culmination of over one years' intensive work. Rising enrolments since the School introduced its radical New Fees Scheme in 2012, meant that managers had to plan quickly to extend the classroom space in the Junior School so that the numbers could be properly catered for in a suitable learning environment.

Plans were swiftly but carefully drawn up and gradually the building took shape, overcoming many obstacles along the way. Aesthetically designed, it provides new classrooms and group assembly spaces in an ideal environment.

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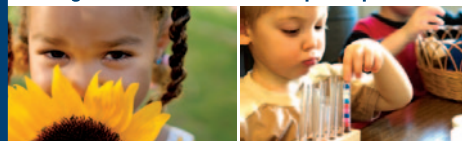


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
